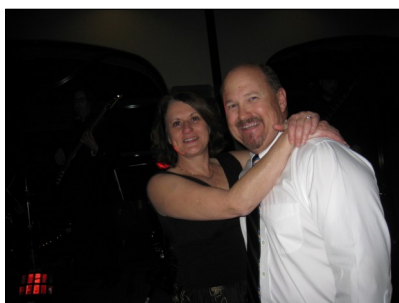
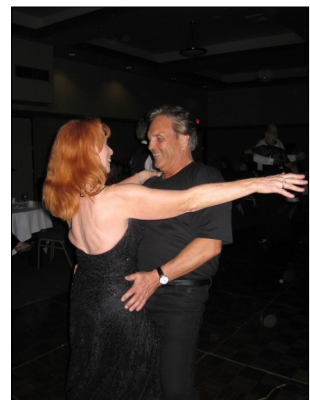
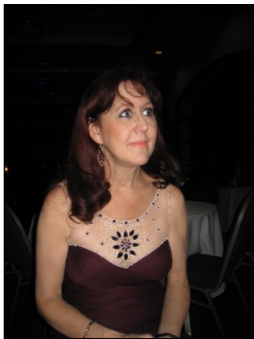

Please make us all rejoice, Mom, and send us lots of snow.

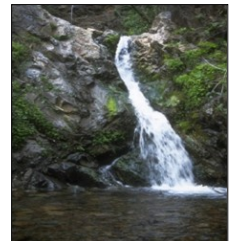
