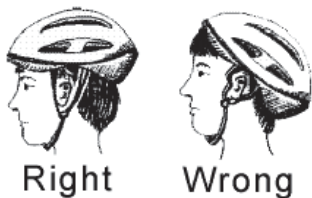

Safety Tips For Cyclists



Now that the warmer weather is here, there will be more cyclists on the road. Here are some safety tips and DMV laws that will help you ride safely.

Bicycle riders on public roads have the same rights and responsibilities as motorists, and are subject to the same rules and regulations. Refer to the [California Driver Handbook](#)

The [California Vehicle Code \(CVC\)](#) contains specific laws pertaining to bicycle riders. For example, it is unlawful to operate a bicycle while under the influence of an alcoholic beverage or a drug (CVC §21200.5).

Convictions are punishable by a fine of up to \$250. If you are under 21, but over 13 years of age, your driving privilege will be suspended or delayed for one year once you are eligible to drive.

- ◆ Obey all traffic laws, including stopping at red lights, stop signs and yielding to pedestrians.
- ◆ Ride with motor vehicle traffic, on the right side of the road.
- ◆ Maintain a straight line; (single file) ride predictably; & avoid swerving between parked cars.
- ◆ Use hand signals to indicate stops, turns, & changes of direction to motorists & pedestrians.
- ◆ Allow faster traffic to pass when it's safe; avoid needlessly blocking the road.
- ◆ Pay attention to parked cars. Drivers may pull out in front of you or open a door in your path.
- ◆ As you approach intersections, be aware of cars behind, beside, and in front of you who may try to cross your path. "Left crosses" are the most frequent motorist-caused bike crashes; "right hooks" rank second.
- ◆ **When riding with others, ride single file to allow motorists to overtake you safely.**
- ◆ Wear a bicycle helmet. (California law requires helmet use for riders under age 18.)
- ◆ When riding at dusk or after dark, use appropriate lights and reflective gear, both to make yourself conspicuous and to see better.

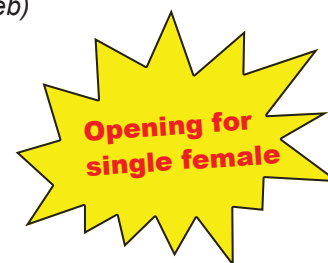

CONDUCT POLICY OF THE CONEJO SKI & SPORTS



Conejo Ski & Sports Club (CSSC) sponsors various activities for a varied population. The CSSC Conduct policy was developed to maximize the enjoyment for all participants and to provide guidelines for CSSC. This policy applies to all persons participating in a CSSC activity. Additionally, if behavior offensive to others (profanity, off-color humor) continues after the offending person is asked by a CSSC representative to refrain from its use, the offending participant may be subject to sanctions up to removal from the activity and/or removal from the club.
