NEWSLETTER ENTRIES



I just want to keep you apprised of my progress. The EIF Revlon Run/Walk is this Saturday and to date I have collected \$1,525.00. Thanks for supporting me in this worthy cause. I am really excited. For those of you who have not yet participated, you may still do so. Below is a copy of my original e-mail to all of you:

March 28th was the 2nd anniversary of my aggressive breast cancer diagnosis. Four hospitalizations, three surgeries, chemo and intravenous Herceptin® every three weeks for a year followed.

I have always supported the Annual EIF Revlon Run/Walk for women financially. Saturday, May 12th will be my 2nd year a participant. Last year I was accompanied by many dear friends, among them was Adi Clark who had been diagnosed two months before me. We were still in treatment when we walked. As we watched the opening ceremony, Holly Barry introduced Dr. Dennis Slamon (Director of the REVLO/UCLA Women's Cancer Research Program) who led the groundbreaking development of the cancer treatment Herceptin® which was funded by this program. When used at the time of diagnosis, Herceptin® can improve survival rates and decrease breast cancer recurrences by more than half. Today the Run/Walk continues to support Dr. Slamon's collaborative research to develop even more effective and less toxic treatments for breast cancer. Tears welled up in me and started running down my face as I realized I was a recipient of his "miracle drug" that would essentially ensure that I and many others would be "survivors". It was a very emotional moment.

I am committed to the fight to end women's cancers because we've all known and loved someone affected by this disease. Let's work to protect the women in our lives; our mothers, daughters, sisters, aunts, grandmothers, wives and friends.

You can join me in the fight against women's cancers by making a donation on my behalf. These are tough economic times. Many of us feel the cost of living has increased at a far greater rate that our income but keep in mind even the smallest donation can make a difference - - they add up. It is not possible to explain the impact of a breast cancer diagnoses but support of this event will guarantee more research until eventually we obliterate this devastating disease.

Bless you all for supporting this worthwhile cause.

THE FOLLOWING IS PROVIDED: Horses, saddles, food, kitchen utensils, & camping equipment. Private tents for singles, couples, or families provided upon request. Food will be plentiful and **deluxe** in quality. Preparation of food is provided however, help is always appreciated. Those that want to learn to pack and make up loads may participate in packing the mules.

Riders: Day one we ride from the pack station to Dorothy Lake which takes about two hours. Following, lunch and leisure time, we ride to a camp on the East Fork of Rock Creek which is about another 45 minutes. Riders cost \$575. Riders Will be camped on the East Fork of Rock Creek. There are nearby ponds and lake. **Hikers:** want to join the trip they can get to the campsite in less than an hour. Or, they can go for a day hike and spend as much time as they want getting to camp. The trail for hikers will depend on how many, and the qualifications of the hikers. Generally, we have hikers depart from the Tamarack trailhead on the Westside of Rock Creek Lake. Cost \$300. They can bring wine and beer. I will give your group one mule to pack in wine, beer and ice. The area we are camping and traveling through is called *The Tamarack Basin*. There are numerous trails alongside of creeks and meadows. We travel to *Francis, Dorothy, Catherine, Dam and Round Lakes*. And, there are numerous ponds in this area. The last day we will return in early afternoon. Generally come back around 3 in the afternoon.
