



- 4. Pick up any unsold gear Sunday, Nov. 4, by 4pm. Any gear not picked up by 4pm Sunday, Nov. 4. 2012, will be donated to local charities.
- 5. We will write you a check for 75% of the net sale of your gear the following week

THE SALE

We call this a SWAP, but this is actually a consignment sale. This means convenience for you. You don't have to hang around trying to sell your equipment. Volunteers from the Conejo Ski & Sports Club and Consignment Sports will sell your gear for you. You just drop off your gear Friday and then on Sunday, you pick up any unsold items by 4pm. After the sale we will let you know which of your gear has sold. We will send a check to you the following week. In the mean time, you can get to the ball game or whatever else is going on. You can, of course also hang out at the swap and help out or look for something new or used to replace the items you are selling.

There is a total limit of 42 spots available on this ski trip. Also, there are only three 3-bedroom condos available. So, the first participants to sign up will have their choices of either a 2 or 3-bedroom condo. The trip price total of \$1,750 is based on the quad-occupancy of a 2-bedroom condo and the six person occupancy of a 3-bedroom condo.

The Aspen/Snowmass Ski Trip Installments are as follows: A \$400 deposit is due upon sign-up. A registration form and club waiver is required to confirm your reservation and to choose your type of condo; 2nd payment of \$1,000 is due by October 15th, 2012 and the final payment of \$350 is due by December 1st, 2012. CONDUCT POLICY OF THE CONEJO SKI & SPORTS CLUB



Conejo Ski & Sports Club (CSSC) sponsors various activities for a varied population.
