# Solstice Canyon Hike Saturday, February 21 8:00 am



Solstice Canyon is a place where one can experience nature. Native Chumash Settlers first used the canyon for food, water and shelter. Homesteader Henry Keller built a stone house in this Malibu Canyon in 1903. The trail leads to the Roberts house, which was designed in 1952 by renowned African American architect Paul Williams, and was destroyed by a fire. An arched stone courtyard garden terrace, ruins and exotic tropical plants still remain. Near the ruins, a waterfall, cascades 30 feet over sandstone rocks. The trail meanders through a lush canyon with a sweeping vista. The hike is 4 miles roundtrip with an elevation gain of 1,000 feet.

Meet promptly at 8:00 am at the Kanan Rd carpool lot. Bring hiking shoes, plenty of water, munchies, hat and sunscreen. Bring \$\$ for a fresh seafood lunch afterwards.



\*The 2015 Banff Ski Trip Package is \$1,775. There are a number of deductions and additions that lower and raise the package price of this ski trip. Seniors (65+) can deduct \$40 off of the package price, non-skiers and skiers that supply their own lift ticket can deduct \$325, (the \$325 Discount is not combinable with the \$40 Seniors Discount). You can add \$70 to the Banff Trip Package if you wish to pre-pay for a 6th day of skiing at any of the 3 mountains. Both Fairmont Hotels Lodging Prices are based on Double-Occupancy, so roommates are required for this trip. If you do not have a roommate, there will be a \$650 single supplement charge for those staying in their own room.

\* A Registration Form, Club Waiver, Canadian Waiver & copy of your Passport are required at sign-up! The 2015 Banff-Lake Louise Trip Installment Plan is as follows: A non-refundable \$600 deposit is due upon first sign-up; a non-refundable 2<sup>nd</sup> installment of \$600 is due by October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2014 and a non-refundable final payment of \$575 will be due by November 5, 2014. 





# CONDUCT POLICY OF THE CONEJO SKI & SPORTS CLUB

Conejo Ski & Sports Club (CSSC) sponsors various activities for a varied population. CSSC may also choose, for the benefit of all participants, to prohibit smoking or alcohol at an event. Participants, who display obnoxious or offensive behavior in violation of this conduct policy, as determined by the CSSC activity representative, may be removed and/or isolated from the group.
