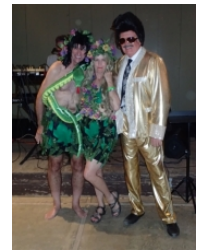


2016 Lake Cachuma Trip





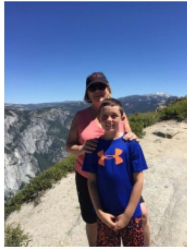
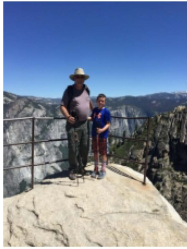
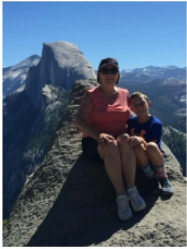
