Election Committee Members and the Chairperson to be approved by the membership at this Club meeting. Any other of the membership at large who voice that they would like to join this committee will also be voted on tonight.

February 7, 2018

Any further persons of membership who have come forward to the on the Election Committee since the January 18th meeting, will be voted in tonight by the membership at our scheduled club meeting.

March 7, 2018

Announcement of Nominees will be given tonight, as well as Nominees from the floor. The Committee will also be soliciting candidate for Man and Woman of the Year.

Man and Woman of the Year nominations shall be a member (not currently serving on the Board) and has not won the Man or Woman of the year for the past five (5) years. They must meet these qualifications and must have contributed to the club during the past year and must be willing to have their name on the ballot. Lighthouse Reef Cont...

Our trip starts with an overnight inland adventure to Crooked Tree Wildlife Sanctuary and then takes us by boat through the warm Caribbean Sea to Lighthouse Reef Atoll. Lighthouse Reef is a well-known tropical marine park and UNESCO World Heritage site fifty-five miles from the Belize mainland. Abundant with marine life, this Atoll offers unparalleled snorkeling and paddling. We will spend four nights at this remote location in comfortable safari-style tent cabanas. 


