

# **New Policy:**

At their March meeting, the Board passed a motion to limit all overnight trips/activities to current club members only, thus effectively eliminating "guest fess" for those trips/activities. Any non-member wishing to attend such events will be required to pay the current membership fee upon signing up. This action formalizes an informal policy initiated last fall by the Executive V.P. and the V.P.s of Skiing and Mammoth. The purpose is to limit club insurance liability and to simplify our IRS accounting procedures.
