**H**i everyone.

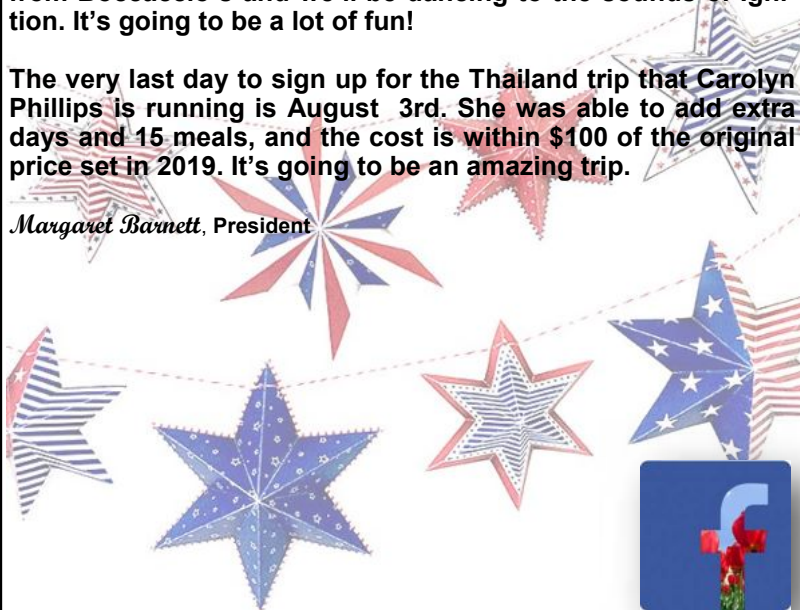

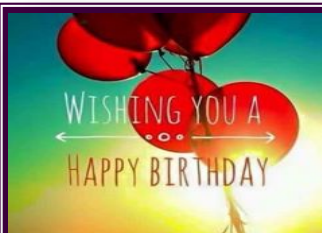

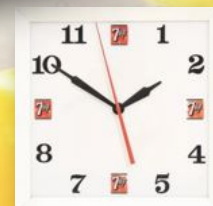

**(READ BEFORE SIGNING)**

In consideration of being allowed to participate, in any way, in the Conejo Ski & Sports Club programs, related events, and activities I, \_\_\_\_\_ (Participant's Name Printed) the Undersigned, acknowledge, appreciate, and agree that:

1. The risk of injury from many of the activities is significant, including the potential for permanent paralysis and death, and while particular skills, rules, equipment, and personal discipline may reduce this risk, the risk of serious injury does exist; and,

2. **I KNOWINGLY AND FREELY ASSUME ALL SUCH RISKS, both known and unknown, EVEN IF ARISING FROM THE NEGLIGENCE OF THE RELEASEES** or others and assume full responsibility for my participation; and,

3. I willingly agree to comply with the stated and customary terms and conditions for participation. If, however, I observe any unusual significant hazard during my presence or participation, I will remove myself from participation and bring such to the attention of the nearest official immediately; and,

4. I, for myself and on behalf of my heirs, assigns, personal representatives and next of kin, **HEREBY RELEASE AND HOLD HARMLESS** Conejo Ski & Sports Club, their officers, officials, agents, and/or employees, other participants, sponsoring agencies, sponsors, advertisers, and, if applicable, owners and lessors of premises used to conduct the event ("**RELEASEES**"), **WITH RESPECT TO ANY AND ALL INJURY, DISABILITY, DEATH, LOSS OR DAMAGE TO PERSON OR PROPERTY, WHETHER ARISING FROM THE NEGLIGENCE OF THE RELEASEES OR OTHERWISE**, to the fullest extent permitted by law.

Activity participant agrees that this release will apply to all known and unknown as well as unanticipated claims, injuries and damages resulting from club activities, as well as, those now disclosed and all rights under section 1542 of the Civil Code of California are hereby expressly waived. Section 1542 of the Civil Code of California reads as follows:

**"A general release does not extend to claims which the (person signing the release) does not know or suspect to exist in his (or her) favor, at the time of execution of the release, which if known by him (or her) must have materially affected his (or her) signing the release."**

In addition, I have read, understand and agree to the Conejo Ski & Sports Club (CSSC) Conduct Policy which states: *"All participants are required to observe common courtesy and generally accepted standards of behavior. CSSC will not tolerate violation of any federal, state, or local laws or ordinances. Illegal use of drug, tobacco or alcohol will cause the participant to be removed from the event. Additionally, CSSC will not reimburse the participant for any forfeited payments. CSSC may also choose, for the benefit of all participants, to prohibit smoking or alcohol at events. # WTF about the **F** explained

## Angelo Accardi's "poetic guerrilla" Copied & edited from SicilyLab.com

Angelo Accardi is a contemporary artist, exponent of Pop Surrealism, known in the international market for his "Misplaced", environments such as museums, galleries and urban scenes, invaded by colorful ostriches whose presence in his visionary staging generates a feeling of alienation. Accardi is the promoter of a "poetic guerrilla" which, simultaneously...[brought] to Palermo, Milan and Venice a monumental sculpture representing the word "FUCK" and which ideally forms a trilogy inaugurated by Robert Indiana with his iconic "LOVE "And" HOPE ". The work "FUCK" made of enameled metal...[was] simultaneously placed in Villa Bonanno in front of the Royal Palace in Palermo, in Palazzo Balbi Valier overlooking the Grand Canal in Venice, in Milan...at the Certosa Graphic Village on the occasion of the Milano Graphic Festival and...at the BASE.

"Fuck" is for Accardi "a detonator through which anyone can relaunch their daily rebellion that aspires to freedom, a rebellion that does not make victims or prisoners, but frees the creative energy that our lifestyle prevents us from expressing. My goal today is above all to represent a liberating scream that removes negativities from contemporary society, with its contradictions, injustices and emergencies of these days and that make our life an incubator of anger ".

"FUCK is an installation, almost an invasion of public art, – underlines Patrizia Monterosso, director general of the Federico II Foundation – conceived by the artist Angelo Accardi as a call to creative arms proposed by the art world, articulated and finalized to the realization of public art interventions and urban regeneration... "Angelo Accardi's sculpture at Villa Bonanno – says Mario Zito, Councilor for Culture of the municipality of Palermo – is a message of hope, a symbol of peace, for a positive future, a moment of sharing in equal human rights. In this unprecedented context, Culture does not stop, on the contrary it is fully involved, to keep alive the memory of those who today live a tormented moment, victims of a human tragedy, renewing attention to a civil memory ".

# Highlights of Days In Covid Captivity in Taormina, Sicily

I watch the robotic vacuum cleaner wend its way across the enormous turquoise swimming pool two floors below my terrace.

It's a fascinating creature which moves from one side to the other, up the walls and down, slithers down into the deep water and up again, its speed precise, unchanging.

Beyond the pool, a placid deep blue Mediterranean Sea stretches into an infinite mist while here, high above the sea in this hotel room in Taormina, confined to my room by a positive Covid test, I look out at the scintillating shoreline of Sicily spread out before me as far as my eyes can see.

But, oh, until now, its been a whirlwind of activity and amazement

Ancient Gothic castles and fortresses, fabulous food, fun with friends and wine, lots of wine.

Beautiful pristine beaches brimming with beautiful nearly bare bodies, baroque cathedrals from centuries past, more wine and chocolate, lots of chocolate.

Greek temples which rival Athens' Acropolis, Roman villas with miraculous mosaics, all dating back to the 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> centuries B.C., more wine and gelato, lots of gelato.

A lovely wine tasting and food pairing followed by a gondola ride up Mt. Etna, for a failed attempt to hike a mile up to the crater rim, failed not due to the wine but to Etna's burping smoke and spitting rocks, then down the mountain and more wine – lots more wine

The next day, 24 hours before we were to fly home, came the required and sadly condemning, Covid test.

Of course, there are worse places one might be sequestered in quarantine and I am not by myself here since more than 20 of my travel mates are similarly

secluded by this imperative isolation, and actually within

chatting distance from one balcony to another, next to

or above the one attached to my room. But we're an active

group and such confinement is an unwelcome concept

and this is barely 2/3 of the way through day 1 and there

are 9 days to go.

I have walked back and forth the length and width of my room and terrace, imagining what that robotic vacuum cleaner might feel like if it were a feeling creature.

I have yet to master climbing the walls, but I have 9 more

days to try.

Day 3 - 5-28 No sign of sun as I look out to the sea this early

morning. The blue sky gradually turns to white cloud, then

to mist as it finally dips into the sea, fading like an overly

wet watercolor painting.

Day 5 – Early, before anyone is outside at the swimming pool,

the sea is calm and glassy, the stillness a meditation, the only

sound a lovely continuous cooing choir of pigeons from every

direction. There's something about the birds in Sicily which

I noticed the very first day. Like the people here, they exhibit

a robust joy, singing loud and constant as they fly overhead

(the birds, not the people).

Day 6 – I watch from the terrace all the people down there

at the pool, some swimming, some just sunning. The lack

of body consciousness of European people is enviable. I giggle

at oversized women wearing thong bathing suits as they lie face

down, spread eagled on lounges, full moons enough to block the sun

under different circumstances. And the men, especially older men,

not so surreptitiously adjust their pride in their skimpy speedo trunks,

huge bellies hanging over while they joke in incoherent Italian

with their cronies.

Day 7 – As the sun begins to set, there are moments the clouds

arrange themselves into squiggly lines tinted with pink and blue

and even green and move slowly, swirling, reminiscent of

the Aurora borealis I saw in Iceland, an odd comparison since

it's been 90 degrees here most days.

We are being moved to a different hotel tomorrow for the balance

of our quarantine, one closer to the airport, and I've heard with

more freedom of movement. I will miss this gorgeous view but

at least I'll feel a step closer to home. I sure could use some

wine but I doubt my travel insurance would appreciate wine being

part of my claim for the meager meals I've been ordering from

room service – but at least a gelato.

## CANADA/NEW ENGLAND STATES FALL FOLIAGE CRUISE

OCTOBER 5-14, 2022 CSSC CST # 2109794 & Vacations-to-Go CST # 2043190

We will arrive in Quebec City mid-morning on October 6<sup>th</sup> and head off for a special Ile d'Orleans Tour (possibly with wine tastings at a vineyard or two) for the afternoon. We then check into our 4-star hotel, the Courtyard by Marriott in Quebec City (it has a Starbucks located inside for those diehard coffee lovers). Welcome Dinner at the hotel with wine is included. All rooms include 2 queen beds. The next morning after breakfast, we check out and head off to our pre-selected bike or city walking tour. One bike tour is a flat 16 miles, and goes to the famous **Montmorency Falls**, with stops at points of interest along the way. When we arrive at the bottom of the falls, we'll take a cable car to the top of the cliff, for a breathtaking view of the falls. We will walk over to a suspended bridge where there is a panoramic view of the Saint Lawrence Seaway. The other bike tour is the Lower Town tour, and is a flat 8 miles of fabulous site seeing in the historical district and heritage sites, exploring some of the more revitalized neighborhoods and plunging into the heart of the French Quebecois culture, with a stop at a Farmers Market with local products and tastings (we must have a minimum of 6 guests for this tour). There is an option for an "E" bike for an additional fee of approximately \$20. For those that feel they just can't do any biking, you will be included in a walking tour of the historical city (we must have a minimum of 4 guests for this tour). After our tours we will be picked up by our private coach and taken to the port to board our cruise ship, the **Norwegian Pearl** and sail for the next 7 days. Our cruise ship will stop at the following places:

Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island; Sydney, Nova Scotia; Halifax, Nova Scotia; Bar Harbor, Maine and Portland, Maine. We disembark the ship in Boston, MA.

The below prices include the guided island tour, the city bike (or walking) tour, the hotel with dinner/wine and breakfast and private coach. The below prices do not include ship gratuities of about \$10 per day and do not include air. Air is not available this far out.
