



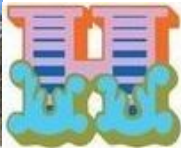

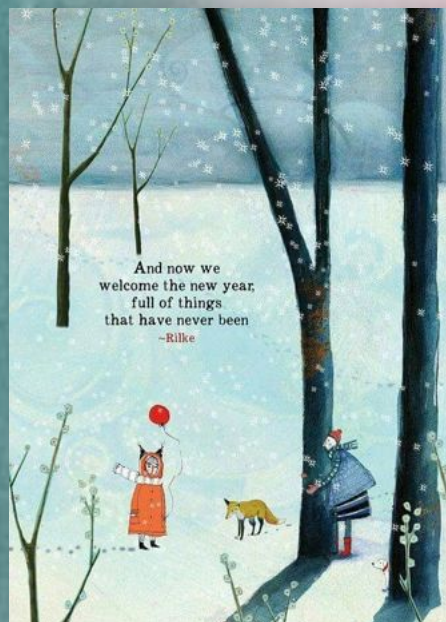

WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY AND CONDUCT POLICY
(READ BEFORE SIGNING)

In consideration of being allowed to participate, in any way, in the Conejo Ski & Sports Club programs, related events, and activities I, _____ (Participant's Name Printed) the Undersigned, acknowledge, appreciate, and agree that:

1. The risk of injury from many of the activities is significant, including the potential for permanent paralysis and death, and while particular skills, rules, equipment, and personal discipline may reduce this risk, the risk of serious injury does exist; and,

2. **I KNOWINGLY AND FREELY ASSUME ALL SUCH RISKS, both known and unknown, EVEN IF ARISING FROM THE NEGLIGENCE OF THE RELEASEES** or others and assume full responsibility for my participation; and,

3. I willingly agree to comply with the stated and customary terms and conditions for participation. If, however, I observe any unusual significant hazard during my presence or participation, I will remove myself from participation and bring such to the attention of the nearest official immediately; and,

4. I, for myself and on behalf of my heirs, assigns, personal representatives and next of kin, **HEREBY RELEASE AND HOLD HARMLESS** Conejo Ski & Sports Club, their officers, officials, agents, and/or employees, other participants, sponsoring agencies, sponsors, advertisers, and, if applicable, owners and lessors of premises used to conduct the event ("**RELEASEES**"), **WITH RESPECT TO ANY AND ALL INJURY, DISABILITY, DEATH, LOSS OR DAMAGE TO PERSON OR PROPERTY, WHETHER ARISING FROM THE NEGLIGENCE OF THE RELEASEES OR OTHERWISE**, to the fullest extent permitted by law.

Activity participant agrees that this release will apply to all known and unknown as well as unanticipated claims, injuries and damages resulting from club activities, as well as, those now disclosed and all rights under section 1542 of the Civil Code of California are hereby expressly waived. Section 1542 of the Civil Code of California reads as follows:

"A general release does not extend to claims which the (person signing the release) does not know or suspect to exist in his (or her) favor, at the time of execution of the release, which if known by him (or her) must have materially affected his (or her) signing the release."

In addition, I have read, understand and agree to the Conejo Ski & Sports Club (CSSC) Conduct Policy which states: *"All participants are required to observe common courtesy and generally accepted standards of behavior. CSSC will not tolerate violation of any federal, state, or local laws or ordinances. Illegal use of drug, tobacco or alcohol will cause the participant to be removed from the event. Additionally, CSSC will not reimburse the participant for any forfeited payments. CSSC may also choose, for the benefit of all participants, to prohibit smoking or alcohol at events. Participants who display obnoxious or offensive behavior in violation of this conduct policy, as determined by the CSSC event representative, may be removed and/or isolated from the group. 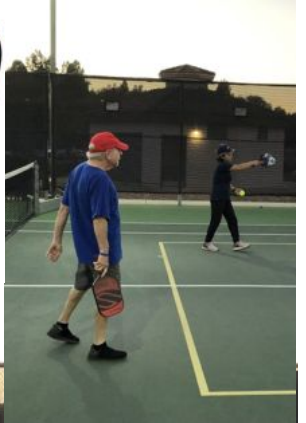

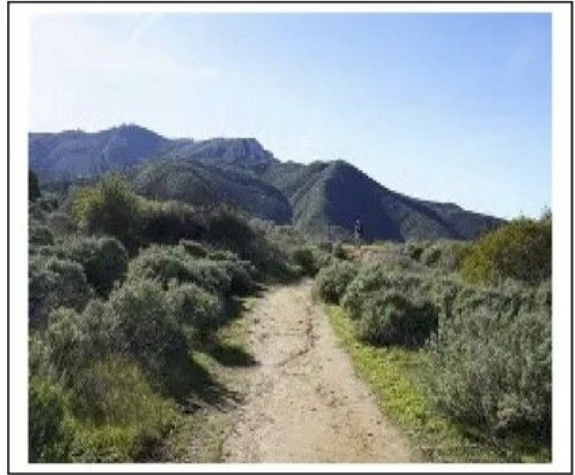

Alamos Canyon Park, Simi Valley

DESCRIPTION OF HIKE: Moderate 6 mile hike with 725' of elevation gain/loss. We'll park at Oak Park Campground (**\$5 per vehicle**). Hike is rated moderate for length and elevation. Very fit beginners welcome. Length of hike is about 3 hours.

PREPAREDNESS: Bring 2-3 liters/quarts of water (or other suitable liquid). Lug-soled shoes are appropriate footwear. No slick tennis shoes.

DIRECTIONS: Park at Oak Park Campground, located at 901 Quimisa Drive, Simi Valley, CA **TIME:** 9:00 a.m. Hike starts promptly at 9:15.

Entrance to Oak Park Campground is not well-marked. From the 118, take the Collins Road exit and head west. Take Arroyo Drive approximately 1.8 miles to Quimisa Drive and turn left. Continue past the railroad tracks and go through the kiosk and park either at the Alamos Canyon trailhead marker sign or further into the park and come back to the sign.

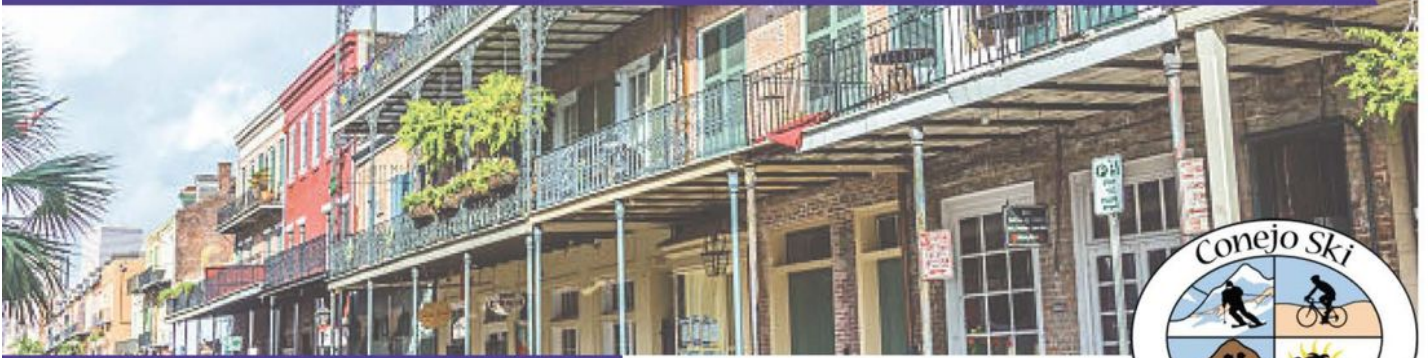

THIS TRIP IS FOR PHYSICALLY FIT AND VERY ACTIVE INDIVIDUALS



It is a world with two faces, where sand and water dominate during the changeover from low to high tide and where islands of all sizes line up like pearls on a chain. There are tidal channels, seagrass meadows, mussel beds, sandbanks, mudflats, salt marshes, beaches and dunes. The Frisian Seas is the habitat of marine mammals such as seals and porpoises, and the breeding ground and wintering area for millions of birds. The area is one of the last remaining large-scale, low tide ecosystems where natural processes continue to function. Furthermore, you will visit the famous freshwater lake IJsselmeer and its beautiful coastline with many fishing villages and old trading harbor towns.

Highlights of the trip are the North Sea islands of Texel and Terschelling and their beautiful natural areas, small villages and long sandy beaches that you can explore by bicycle. Everyone will have an e-bike. Highlights on the coasts of the mainland in the provinces of North-Holland and Friesland are a combination of rural areas, small villages and picturesque harbor towns: a true “El Dorado” for cyclists.

Leafde fan Fryslan is an imposing four-masted schooner which made its maiden voyage in the spring of 2018. The interior of this recently restyled ship can best be described as refined. On the lower deck there are 12 well-equipped double cabins, 1 smaller double cabin, 1 junior suite and 2 single person cabins. On the upper deck there are 4 magnificent suites with a hotel-style bed, a double glass sliding door and a small private balcony. In the afternoon the ship will arrive on Terschelling Island, which features a number of picturesque villages situated between the polder and sand dunes. Tonight, there is no dinner on board.
